Reading

If you read for just 20 minutes a day, then you will learn more than 2 million words per year! Sharing stories with adults and your brothers and sisters, or reading alone each day has many benefits. Remember that books don't necessarily have to be school books; you can read a wide range of other things too - magazines, signs on television, labels on shopping, whatever you are interested in. Along with reading for pleasure, you could keep a diary or log of what you have been reading. Listening to stories is also fabulous! Ask your adults at home to read you stories or make up stories to tell you.

There are some e-books here on our website under the 'Books to read at home' section . Please feel free to read one , do be careful though to choose a one that is at the appropriate level.

In the Autumn Term , 2022 we will be exploring the following topics, therefore, over the summer it would be helpful if you could carry out the following tasks ...

English- Labels and Captions.

When you are out and about, can you see any labels anywhere? Maybe an adult could take a photo and you could bring it in to school. Can you read any labels around you? Can you write some labels to identify things around your house?

Maths - In maths this term we will be looking at number and place value to 100. Can you write any number from 1 to 100 and then say how many tens and ones it has? Look at the number square below. Ask an adult to shout out a number from it. Can you point to it? How may 10's and ones does it have?
